Homelessness in Perth & Australia:

The Real Picture

<u>Perth:</u> As of May 2023, approximately 1,033 individuals were experiencing homelessness in the Perth metropolitan area, including those sleeping rough or in temporary shelters.

<u>Western Australia:</u> Children under 18 make up 20.5% of the homeless population, and 19.1% are older individuals aged 55 and above.

Nationally: On any given night, 122,494 people in Australia are experiencing homelessness.

Common Causes of Homelessness

Homelessness is often the result of complex, interrelated factors:

Domestic and family violence financial hardship and poverty Lack of affordable housing Mental health issues Unemployment or underemployment

These challenges can affect anyone, regardless of background, and are often beyond an individual's control.

Addressing the Issue

Increase affordable and social housing options

Provide comprehensive support services for mental health, addiction, and domestic violence
